Learn how you can help someone struggling with suicidal thoughts.

ASIST is an interactive training that supports community members to feel more comfortable and competent in helping to prevent the immediate risk of suicide.

What will you learn:

- Learn how to recognize suicide risk and assist a person at risk to “keep safe for now”.
- Experience powerful videos on suicide intervention.
- Feel challenged and safe.
- See, hear and learn the information and skills needed to provide suicide first aid.

Who should attend:

This course is appropriate for anyone 16 years and older who wants to learn suicide intervention skills.
