I'm preparing to do another Trauma Informed Self Care class for Butte County Children's Services, a webinar series for Strategies 2.0, a research poster for National Ayurvedic Medical Association, and my entire 16 Weeks to Resilience program for FEMA in the coming months before hurricane season starts.

Finally, I'm preparing to do another Trauma Informed Yoga & Ayurveda Training for professionals in September & October to help organizations take advantage of the Trauma Informed wave of interest with enough skilled instructors to teach basic movement and breathing techniques to support trauma recovery in special populations.

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What would you like colleagues in the community to know and understand about your organization?:

I work primarily with former foster youth who are eligible for case management through work and/or school. I have specific funding to help them pay bills, take care of emergencies and save. I may not be able to work with all of the youth in Nevada County (as we all would want to) because they have to have been in foster care at least a day at 16 years old but I am helping these fragile young adults and always need resources to give them an extra hand so I am appreciative of these county collaborative meetings.

Current Collaborations &/or Opportunities or Desires for Collaboration: I attend these county meetings for both sides- to get referred any former foster youth if anyone knows of anyone and to learn about resources to offer them. I also help my colleague and supervisor with the Independent Living Program, also for current or former foster youth, and we provide resources and trainings for our kids that some of you may be able to be involved with or have information we can pass on to them.

**What would you like colleagues in the community to know and understand about your organization?:**

SNCS administers several program to assist parents and child care providers. In addition to providing financial assistance with child care and providing child care referrals we also administer state grant funds to improve the quality and quantity of child care in Sierra and Nevada County.

**Current Collaborations &/or Opportunities or Desires for Collaboration:** 1. Last year, through the Foster Bridge Program we started offering Foster Families immediate child care when referred from CPS. Foster Families receive extended referral services and priority in long-term care through our child care eligibility program.

2. We received funding to address the declining family child care homes, which have been in decline since the recession. This funding is being used to support and offer financial assistance to those wishing to get their license and run a Family Child Care business. We also offer continuing support and professional development training.
