- Be careful of injecting your self-interest and label it as such. Be able to layout your agency's interest and be open to other's interests.
- Meetings are meaningful and have a shared purpose.

## Social Connections – March 6, 2019

Social connections are essentially relationships, and one of the common threads that runs throughout the 40 Assets is building & promoting positive relationships, with families & old and young friends and within neighborhoods, schools, and community. Positive relationships are involved in 20 of the assets, among them:

#3 Other adult relationships; #15 Positive peer influence; #18 Youth programs; #19 Religious community; #4,10 Caring, Safe in neighborhood; #5,10,24 Caring, Safe at, Bonding to school; #7 Community values youth; #18 Youth programs, #19 Religious community; #26 Caring for others; #27 Equality & social justice; #33,34 Interpersonal, cultural competence.

Social connections are the basis for providing emotional and concrete supports when needed, for helping to prevent isolation that can lead to complex problems, and for recovery from those problems.

Agencies can encourage parents to have every child engaged in at least one structured, adult (and awesome youth) run activity that includes other youth, e.g. religious organization, team sport, scouts, musical group (chorus, band, orchestra, drama), NEO, Friendship Club, 4H, school club.
