Community Support Network of Nevada County Meeting Agreements

- Make decisions by consensus.
- Create an atmosphere of mutual respect that includes active listening and listening without judging.
- Start and end on time.
- Maintain a sense of humor and a positive attitude.
- Bring concerns to the whole group. Don't take them to the parking lot after the meeting.
- Set up the room in an inclusive way.
- Take responsibility for a task only if you have the time to accomplish it.
- Everyone is empowered to be a process observer and take ownership for the health of the meeting and is responsible for the health of the whole meeting.
- Be sensitive to others' need for more information. Make sure everyone understands.
- Be careful of injecting your self-interest and label it as such. Be able to layout your agency's interest and be open to other's interests.
- Meetings are meaningful and have a shared purpose.
- This is a living document and can be changed as needed.

Developmental Asset – #40 – Positive View of Personal Future

Young person is optimistic about her or his personal future.

- Parent, agency, and community responsibility
- Encourage each young person to find their passion in life
 - Youth need exposure to possibilities, both for finding their interests and what living a life with that passion might look like, e.g. occupations, hobbies, research, teaching, etc.
 - Their passions are often unrecognized but visible at a young age (+- 8 years old). Often related to what they like to do or what strengths they have.
 - Be open to ANY passion (e.g. Steven Spielberg's early years when he filmed messes he created).
- Youth need support for their passions
 - o Enlist neighbors, friends, books, field trips, prominent people in area of passion
- Help youth plan and set goals so they learn they have control about their futures
- Make sure you spend time with your passion frequently, at least weekly, even if only reading!

- Be positive about their future! This may be difficult in today's milieus with real and fake news
 and opinions coming from all directions. Help your children understand all viewpoints of
 controversial issues, whether local or international, point out challenging times in the past
 which are now behind us, and suggest possible ways their passions may be applied to make a
 difference.
