Leading for Resilience

We are very excited to present our final session with Ricky Robertson and Amber Warner on **November 9th from 3:00 - 4:30 p.m.**

This workshop session will explore how the pandemic has impacted the health of our communities by contributing to rising unemployment, substance use, and social isolation. Our educators are carrying the weight of supporting students and families while also adapting to distance and hybrid teaching. School administrators play a critical role during this time in supporting the well-being of their learning communities. In this session, we will explore trauma-responsive social-emotional supports that foster staff and student resilience.

<u>California Health Education</u> <u>Framework (HEF) Rollout Project</u>

The HEF Project aims to shift educators to more advanced student-centered, skill-based teaching and learning practices, as well as health content, while building a statewide system of support for health education. A series of professional learning opportunities will be provided in 2020 and 2021. The first session will focus on the overarching framework guidance and implementation resources to support educators. The training includes both asynchronous and synchronous learning modules and will provide all of the information you need to get started implementing the new framework.

Nevada County Teachers Seek to Remove Learning Barriers for Students in Virtual Learning Environments

Forty teachers from nine school districts and one charter school came together virtually to participate in Year 3 of the Nevada County Network Improvement Community project. The project focuses on utilizing research based Universal Design for Learning strategies to remove barriers to learning for students. The NCSOS Instructional Leadership Coaching Team along with Nicole Tucker-Smith of LessonCast are working closely with teachers across the county to develop strategic lesson plans to foster the development of expert learners in their students.

In previous years teachers met face-to-face. However, with our current circumstances, participants have had to meet via Zoom. This has actually allowed more teachers to participate, collaborate and learn and grow together professionally. These teacher leaders are particularly focused on increasing student engagement in a Distance Learning context. They will attend four webinars to learn about the Universal Design for Learning Framework and meet regularly with the NCSOS instructional coaches to develop and debrief lessons they have developed with Universal Design for Learning strategies over the course of the school year.
