## KINDERGARTEN ROUND UP



Are you making plans for your kids to start TK or Kindergarten in August?

Students that are 5 years old on or before Sept. 1, 2021 will be enrolled in Kindergarten.

Students that are turning 5 years old between Sept. 2 and Dec. 2, 2021 will be eligible for Transitional Kindergarten (TK).

You will need to bring the following documents when registering your child:

Birth Verification - birth certificate, baptismal certificate or registrar's statement  
Immunization Records

Proof of Residency - utility bill, rental agreement, new home purchase agreement with physical address  
Court ordered legal papers (if applicable)

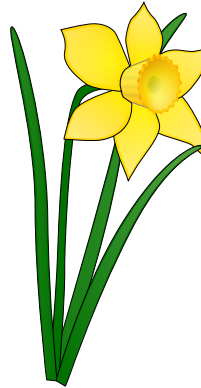
## PENN VALLEY DAFFODIL RUN

## The Power of Three

The Power of Three teachers your child to better understand an expectation or be more comfortable with a new experience. It will help to calm a child's anxiety, provide clear expected behaviors, and bring a sense of order to the family. It provides a learning experience with the parents' help prior to the real event and helps children feel safer.

## PARENTING PARTNERS Parenting Tips with Annie

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1. Tell child before event what behavior you expect, perhaps the night before
2. Tell them in the morning before the event
3. Tell them just before the event

The way that you "tell" your child this information can take on a variety of learning styles. If you are taking them to meet a new family for the first time you could:

1. Tell them as best you can what to expect (audial learning)
2. Show them pictures of the new friends (visual learning)
3. Role-play with action, dolls, cars, ect (kinesthetic learning)

This repetition provides an opportunity for your child to learn and practice the new and potentially scary event.
